Where is the land of Noah's Ark?

There Were no Vowels In the original Hebrew, so the actual letters of the Biblical text, 'rrt' could be read 'aRaRaT', or uRaRTu', or Any other number of ways.

According to the Bible, the Ark came to rest <u>not</u> on *Mount* Ararat, but on the *mountains* of Ararat, or, more correctly translated, the mountains of Urartu.



Urartu, also called the Kingdom of Van, was a loose federation of tribes, living in the area near Lake Van, the Araxes River, and Mount Ararat (Mount Masis, in Armenian) at least as early as 1200 BC. Archaeologists have every reason to believe, however, that the mountains of

Ararat were the home of great peoples – from the very beginning of civilization.

When Noah came down from the Ark, he became a farmer, and planted the first vineyard.

Does that surprise us? Archaeologists have found evidence of the earliest wine production in this region.

It is one of the oldest and one of the most familiar stories ever told, of Noah, the Ark and the Great Flood. Written down in the 8th Century before Christ and set about 5,000 years ago, the story is as alive as ever today.

We learn it as children, and Noah's Ark is one of the most popular subjects for toys and books and puzzles. The story is so embedded in our minds that the simplest drawing of the Ark needs no explanation.

We know that God was angry with mankind and planned to send a great flood to destroy all living things. But God took pity on Noah, and gave him very precise instructions:

Build an Ark of gopher wood, and get your family and select sets of animals on board with you. Then God sent the rain – forty days and forty nights of it. Water covered the mountains to a depth of more than twenty feet, and flooded the earth for 150 days. And every living creature God had made was wiped from the face of the earth. When the flood ended, the Ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat, and Noah, his Family and the animals survived to replenish the earth.
