## TODAY'S GOSPEL: Matthew 20:29-21:17

And as they went out of Jericho, a great crowd followed him. And behold, two blind men sitting by the roadside, when they heard that Jesus was passing by, cried out, "Have mercy on us, Son of David!" The crowd rebuked them, telling them to be silent; but they cried out the more, "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David!" and Jesus stopped and called them, saying,

"What do you want me to do for you?" They said to him, "Lord, let our eyes be opened." And Jesus in pity touched their eyes, and immediately they received their sight and followed him.

And when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find an ass tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If any one says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord has need of them,' and he will send them immediately." This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying, "Tell the daughter of Zion, Behold, your king is coming to you, hmble, and mounted on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of an ass." The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the ass and the colt, and put their garments on them, and he sat thereon. Most of the crowd spread their garments on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. And the crowds that went before him and that followed him shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" And when he entered Jerusalem, all the city was stirred, saying, "Who is this?" And the crowds said, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth of Galilee."

And Jesus entered the temple of God and drove out all who sold and bought in the temple, and he overturned the tables of the money@changers and the seats of those who sold pigeons. He said to them, "It is written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer'; but you make it a den of robbers."

And the blind and the lame came to him in the temple, and he healed them. But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the wonderful things that he did, and the children crying out in the temple, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" they were indignant; and they said to him, "Do you hear what these are saying?" And Jesus said to them, "Yes; have you never read, 'Out of the mouths of babes and sucklings you have brought perfect praise'?" And leaving them, he went out of the city to Bethany and lodged there.



His Eminence Archbishop Khajag informed us that His Beatitude Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, in his comatose condition, was transferred to a hospice facility for ongoing care. We continue our prayers for his comfort.

### **HOW TO MAKE A PALM CROSS**

On Palm Sunday, Armenians receive blessed palms in memory of the glorious procession of Jesus into Jerusalem. We read in John 12:12-13 how people "took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying 'Hosanna',,," Traditionally these palms are fashioned into small crosses and displayed in the home all year long.



# WHY CAN WE TAKE COMMUNION ON PALM SUNDAY?

Actually, the Great Lent fasting period of 40 days ends on the Friday before Palm Sunday. The day before Palm Sunday is called Lazarus Saturday. These two fast days constitute a preparation for Holy Week, which is another 5-day fasting period before Easter. In total, pre- Easter fasting is for 47 days and ends at sundown on Easter Eve.

Receiving Holy Communion on Palm Sunday is allowed because it is the pre-feast of Christ's Resurrection, and the Divine Liturgy is celebrated with an open curtain that allows the normal distribution of the blessed sacrament.

Even though Palm Sunday falls within the 47 days of pre-Easter fasting, according to the Liturgical Calendar, the Armenian Church invites her faithful to the Eucharist because it is the moment when the Savior Himself seeks us out to restore our separated relationship with God in the fullest way possible--receiving Holy Communion. We culminate this relationship with the Resurrected Lord again on Easter.

Our union with God the Father---interrupted by our Lenten fasting, the closed curtain, and the absence of a normal rhythm of receiving Holy Communion-- is restored and begins again on Palm Sunday - a day that stands at the threshold of a union with God that comes with Christ's entry into our hearts and minds, a restored relationship, and so we enter that union with, in, by Christ and His Communion.

Also, Holy Communion is offered during Holy Week on the morning of Holy Thursday during the Holy *Badarak* remembering the Last Supper, and this Divine Liturgy is celebrated with an open curtain.
