TODAY'S GOSPEL: John 12:12-23

The next day a great crowd who had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" and Jesus found a young ass and sat upon it; as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on an ass's colt!" His disciples did not understand this at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that this had been written of him and had been done to him. The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead bore witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. The Pharisees then said to one another, "You see that you can do nothing; look, the world has gone after him." Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew went with Philip and they told Jesus. And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified."

Guidelines for Reverence and Respect during the Divine Liturgy—Soorp Badarak

In the Armenian Orthodox Church when we enter the Holy Temple/Dajar for our sacred service, it is important to remember where we are and who else is present. It is, therefore, necessary to maintain decorum and regard for other worshippers in our dress and attire as well as our behavior, taking note that others present are praying and we should not be a distraction to them when we enter the church while Badarak is taking place. Therefore, please observe the following to guide you in your worshipful behavior and dress code:

- As you enter Christ's Church where God is present ... bless yourself with the sign of the Cross, when exiting and also when you cross or walk by the Holy Altar. Jesus Christ is present always in His Body and Blood, therefore whenever passing by the Altar (whether at the back or front of the church), stop and face the Holy Altar and reverence Him by bowing and blessing yourself.
- Refrain from any long conversation with anyone you encounter.
 We are here to pray, not to have conversations. A friendly smile or greeting by handshake or embrace is fine, but then turn your attention to the Holy Altar and the service itself.
- If you have a candle to offer a prayer before the icons, do so quietly before taking your place in the pew. When reaching your seat, bow your head and bless yourself with the sign of the Cross to begin and enter the prayers of the *Badarak*.
- Use good judgment in your dress on Sundays. Short mini-skirts are not permitted nor are strapless, low cut dresses or blouses, especially if you are to receive Holy Communion. Short shorts and bare feet with thongs in the summer months are not proper either.

- During the General Confession follow along, kneel and respond saying MEGHA ASDOODZOH when instructed by the Deacons.
- During Communion do not chew gum. Women, please remove smudging lipstick. And for all, do not hold conversations while standing in the Communion lines. By tradition, it is customary to wait until after Holy Communion is distributed before returning to your pews, but due to the large number of communicants you may return immediately to your seats.

If you arrive while the Liturgy is in progress, please respectfully wait before entering as instructed by the ushers. Please do not move about during...

- Processions at the Altar or around the Church during the reading of the day's lections from the chancel and at the Holy Altar
- During the recitation of the Nicene Creed
- During the Consecration of the Host and Wine
- During the singing or reciting of the Hayr Mer—The Lord's Prayer)
- · During the Sermon or Homily

At the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy and after the final blessing is offered, it is customary to approach the Holy Gospel and kiss it before departing. Again, standing in line to receive the blessing in the main aisle, please refrain from chit chat and conversations. The persons ahead or behind you may be in thoughtful prayer, so PLEASE be respectful to them. <u>Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.</u>

Detroit Masonic Temple Tour Sponsored by Men's Society of St. John Armenian Church

John Kalajian of the Men's Society of St. John Armenian Church has set up a tour of the Detroit Masonic Temple for Saturday, July 14, 2012. The tour is a family event and children are welcome. The tour will begin at 10 am and last about two hours. There is free parking in the rear of the building off of Second Street. The cost of the tour is a nominal fee of \$5/person which will be donated to the Detroit Masonic Temple Library Fund.

The Masonic Temple is 14 stories tall, has 1037 rooms, has approximately 12 million cubic feet of space, and the main theater stage is the second largest stage in the United States. Besides the seven Craft Lodge Rooms (each having different decorative treatments/styles), there are several ballrooms, a cathedral and a mammoth drill hall comprising 17,500 square feet of open floor space and one of only three "floating floors" to be found in the United States.

Lessons from the Geese

When we all work together the end result is greater than if each of us acts independently. There is a great deal to be learned from the teamwork shown in "Lessons from the Geese."

As each goose flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird following. By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds 71% more flying range than if each bird flew alone.

Lesson: People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going quicker and easier because they are traveling on the thrust of one another.

Whenever a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to fly alone and quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front.

Lesson: If we have as much sense as a goose, we will join in formations with those who are headed where we want to go.

When the lead goose gets tired, it rotates back into the formation and another goose flies at the point position.

Lesson: It pays to take turns doing the hard tasks and sharing leadership - with people, as with geese, interdependent with one other.

The geese in formation honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

Lesson: We need to make sure our honking from behind is encouraging - not something less helpful.

When a goose gets sick or wounded or shot down, two geese drop out of formation and follow their fellow member down to help provide protection. They stay with this member of the flock until he or she is either able to fly again or dies. Then they launch out on their own, with another formation, or catch up with their own flock.

Lesson: If we have as much sense as the geese, we will stand by each other as they do.
