TODAY'S GOSPEL: Luke 12:13-31

One of the multitude said to him, "Teacher, bid my brother divide the inheritance with me." But he said to him, "Man, who made me a judge or divider over you?" And he said to them, "Take heed, and beware of all covetousness; for a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions." And he told them a parable, saying, "The land of a rich man brought forth plentifully; and he thought to himself, 'What shall I do, for I have nowhere to store my crops?' And he said, "I will do this: I will pull down my barns, and build larger ones; and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; take your ease, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God."

And he said to his disciples, "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you shall eat, nor about your body, what you shall put on. For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing. Consider the ravens: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds! And which of you by being anxious can add a cubit to his span of life? If then you are not able to do as small a thing as that, why are you anxious about the rest? Consider the lilies, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of this. But if God so clothes the grass which is alive in the field today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, how much more will he clothe you, 0 men of little faith! And do not seek what you are to eat and what you are to drink, nor be of anxious mind. For all the nations of the world seek these things; and your Father knows that you need them. Instead, seek his kingdom, and these things shall be yours as well."

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN "MAHS" BREAD AND HOLY COMMUNION?

At the beginning of the Divine Liturgy, after the curtain has been closed for the first time, the deacon presents the priest with a tray of unleavened bread including several small, round wafers called *nushkhar*. The priest blesses the bread, then selects one *nushkhar* which he places on the paten or *maqhzman*. This is the bread which will be the focus of all the prayers of the Divine Liturgy, and which will be distributed in Holy Communion. We believe that by God's grace, what we receive in Holy Communion is not mere bread, but the life-giving body of Jesus Christ.

The remaining blessed bread is put aside. This *mahs* which means portion in Armenian, is offered to the faithful at the end of the Divine Liturgy. It is especially intended for those who were unable to come to the *Badarak* to receive Holy Communion. It becomes for them their "portion" of the day's Eucharistic meal.

HOW OFTEN SHOULD I RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION?

Receiving Holy Communion on a regular basis should be at the center of your life as an Armenian Christian. It is the greatest privilege and blessing of Christian life, and has been since Christians began gathering to celebrate the Eucharist. Jesus said, "He who eats my body and drinks by blood dwells in me and I in him" (John 6:56). To share in the Lord's Supper is to profess and celebrate our faith that in Christ, sin and death will no longer separate us from eternal life with God. To receive Holy Communion is to receive the living Son of God into our bodies, into our lives, as divine sustenance, as medicine for forgiveness and expiation of sins, for protection against evil, for the health of the soul and body, and for the performance of all deeds of virtue, as the prayers and hymns of our *Badarak* proclaim.

However, eagerness to receive Holy Communion must always be complemented by reverence for the sanctity of the sacrament, which one must not allow to become a casual or indiscriminate habit.

Sunday Offering / Collection

The offertory - your monetary donation given each week during the Divine Liturgy - will be hereafter taken by the Parish Council and Ushers just prior to the singing of *Der Voghormia*. Our giving to the Lord and His Church is an expression of gratitude and thanksgiving for the many good works and blessings we receive in His name. Time and talent is one way we give to glorify God and help build up His church, but also our love is expressed through our donations, however great or humble to assure that the mission of His church continues.

After the curtain closes for your personal time of prayer and reflection during the singing of the hymn *Der Voghormia*, first the offertory will take place and then with thanksgiving we invite you all to sing with the choir.
