TODAY'S GOSPEL: MARK 10:1-12

NEWS FROM OUR DIOCESE

HISTORIC MEETING IN HOLY ETCHMIADZIN

A conference of bishops of the worldwide Armenian Church will convene at Holy Etchmiadzin, from September 24 to 27.

All of the bishops of the Armenian Apostolic Church, including those belonging to the Great House of Cilicia, will participate in this first-of-its-kind gathering, which will go forward with the blessing and presence of His Holiness Karekin II, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, and His Holiness Aram I, Catholicos of the Great House of Cilicia.

The purpose of the conference will be to discuss the most important issues and challenges facing our church and the Armenian people today. From our Diocese, the Primate Archbishop Khajag Barsamian and Archbishop Vicken Aykazian will be taking part.

His Holiness Karekin II has asked that all our faithful should be apprised of the bishops' conference during the Divine Liturgy on and that they should be encouraged to pray for its success.

May our Lord grant his wisdom to his servants, and guide our church in all its endeavors.

ORIGIN OF RIGHT AND LEFT ...

We may have wondered why right and left are so controversial. Conservatives are called the "right" and liberals are called the "left." In Theology, the right and left have become interpreted and understood in the New Testament.

Not to be political in matters when reading from scripture, and seeking a fair explanation of why the right is such an important image, this verse in the Bible found in *Ecclesiastes 10:2* simply clarifies how 'right and left' could be understood. The text is the authentic translation from the Jewish version of the Old Testament.

A wise man's heart leads him **rightly,** but a fool's heart leads him astray ['left' is often used for 'astray'] *Ecclesiastes 10:2.*

From the <u>Complete Jewish Bible</u>: A New Translation by Dr. David Stern. The Complete Jewish Bible is a translation for particularly Messianic Jews [those who have become Christian] and non-Jews alike. Terms are translated in their original Hebrew and presented in easy-to-understand translation.

NEWS FROM THE DIOCESE

Relic of St. Vartan the Brave Arrives in New York The Saints are both spiritually and physically in our midst... WHAT IS A RELIC?

In the Christian tradition, a relic is a part of the body of a sainted person venerated and honored by the Church. It is also any tangible memorial fragment or piece of clothing attached to or worn by the saint and carefully preserved for purposes of veneration [honoring]. It is placed in a suitable container or vessel that is often publicly displayed.

Relics are an important aspect of our Armenian Orthodox Christian tradition. The word *relic* comes from the Latin *reliquiae*, meaning "remains" or "something left behind" (the same root as *relinquish*). In Armenian it is known as *masoonk* [Uwunup]. A reliquary can also be a shrine that houses one or more religious relics.

On the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross/ *Khachveratz*, New York's St. Vartan Armenian Cathedral became the permanent home to a unique piece of Armenia's sacred history: a holy relic of St. Vartan the Brave.

The relic is the gracious gift of His Holiness Karekin II, the Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, given to the Eastern Diocese in honor of the 45th anniversary of St. Vartan Armenian Cathedral. Diocesan Primate Archbishop Khajag Barsamian accepted the relic on behalf of the Diocese during his recent trip to the Mother See of Holy Etchmiadzin.

The 1,500-year-old relic—a piece of stone encrusted with the blood of Armenia's 5th-century warrior saint—is encased in a beautiful, hand-crafted silver cross, which was sanctified in a special ceremony at the Holy See in late August.

In its cross-shaped reliquary, the relic of St. Vartan was unveiled publicly on Sunday, September 15, as part of the official celebration of the 45th anniversary of St. Vartan Cathedral. Archbishop Barsamian celebrated the Divine Liturgy in the cathedral sanctuary.

NOTICE OF FIRE EMERGENCY EVACUATION PLAN FOR ST. JOHN'S CHURCH AND CHURCH SCHOOL

The Parish Council has undertaken the development of a **FIRE EMERGENCY AND EVACUATION PLAN** for St. John's Armenian Church and Church School. This will be the first step in a plan that will encompass several different types of emergencies (i.e. fire, tornado, lock-down). This fall, we will begin by teaching Church School students, teachers, ushers, choir and Parish Council members the procedures for safe evacuation of the church complex in the event of a fire emergency. We plan on having two "fire drills" involving the entire church and Church School on **October 27th and November 3rd.** This will take place at the end of the church service. Please make every effort to attend church and have your children in Church School so you can participate in this very important drill.

The following are guidelines for parishioners in case of a fire emergency:

In the Sanctuary - Parish Council members, ushers and choir members will be "leaders" trained to guide people safely out of the sanctuary to the big St. John sign and grassy area at the SE corner of the church during a fire emergency.

In the Church School—Teachers and Church School staff will guide students safely out of the building to the grassy area behind the church during a fire emergency.

Other "leaders" will canvas the building to make sure all are safely out of the building. Once it is determined that all is safe, an "ALL CLEAR" notice will be given by the pastor and everyone **must** return to the building to pick up their children and continue the rest of the day as usual.

Thank you for your participation and cooperation during these very important drills.
