FROM FATHER GARABED'S DESK.....

Miracles do happen when we look for them.....

Consider this.....

Of the many miracles that the Holy Gospels speak about, one of the most compelling is our Lord's miraculous walking on water which is both real and symbolic. It is a real story and a real moment when the power of Christ God and Lord, defied nature. As often as we read it we ask "How can a human being walk on liquid

the power of Christ God and Lord, defied nature. As often as we read it, we ask, "How can a human being walk on liquid water?" What our Lord shows us, is that things that appear humanly impossible can become possible with faith, with desire, with hope. And then a miracle happens. HE can change the ordinary of nature into the extraordinary.

The human heart is always filled with a desire to make what seems impossible, indeed, happen. But we are so frequently caught up in daily fears, things that flood our lives, like the waters that were flooding the boat in which the Apostles were sitting. And like them, driven by our fears, our anxieties, we become afraid of sinking, of drowning in our difficulties so much that we can miss a miracle that is happening before our very eyes. This was the case with the Apostles whose fears blinded them from reaching out to Jesus who was walking on water, and thus, witnessing this miraculous moment.

Here in our spiritual home, miracles happen all the time, but our fears overcome us sometimes too much that we miss the miracle moment when Jesus was there to hold our hands, save us, give us courage, hope and strengthen our resolve to survive. This year has been a hard one for the entire nation and our church as well, meeting our budget, trying to balance faith with the difficulties of pressing economic times. Will we get through this, will we raise enough revenue to continue our mission to preach, teach, and celebrate the presence of Jesus in our boat? The answer is yes. We will.

The waves of water will always be coming towards us, rocking our boat, tossing it sometimes so much that we think it might capsize and go under. But every time we rise above our fears and anxieties with faith, we are above those waves and waters, as if walking on them, because we know that Jesus will carry us, and we WILL SEE yet another miracle, and hear the Lord assure us "Don't be afraid, I am with you even to the end of the earth."

In January, we saw a miracle with the rebirth of our Men's Society, sleeping in this boat of St. John's for the past few years. Waters drowned our spirits and we wondered if this group - *Men of Faith* – would rise ever again and surface. Well, with faith, it was reborn; the men overcame the fears of not being able to rise once again to reestablish their place in our parish. Then came new blood, new desire, new hope, renewed spirit, overcoming insecurity and doubt, and what we might have thought to be impossible, became possible. A miracle happened when thirty men came together to walk with Christ, as He reached out to them, they, the Apostles, invited Him into their boat, and became the Men of St. John's.

And so, the lesson is this: with faith, trust and reaching out to Christ Our God, all things can be restored, recovered, and made new and Faith indeed can bring about a miracle every day. Look for it!

Armenia youth to the St. John students. A brief history of Armenia and the Armenian Church was presented.

MAY ~ Thirty-five students and parents pedaled around Hines Park for the first annual St. John Church School Bike-a-thon. The fundraiser raised approximately \$9,000 for *Mer Doon* in Armenia. *Mer Doon* is a home for orphaned women, 18 years and older; providing them a place to live while teaching them work and social skills as they reenter society.

OCTOBER ~ Our children are our greatest resource and we must always encourage and guide them in their Christian faith. The 11th and 12th graders had an honest discussion with a visiting seminarian from St. Nersess Armenian Seminary in New York about the current challenges that our youth face in society and how the Armenian Church addresses those issues. Also, a discussion followed on God's calling to a young man to enter the priesthood and how everyone can participate in the life of the Armenian Church through service.

"Kids Against Hunger" was a project that provided relief to Americans and people abroad who were coping with hunger due to disasters. The students, parents and church school board members packaged 11,000 meals that were shipped to those areas stricken. The project was mainly subsidized by donations from Loucin Dorian, the late Lucy Torigian, parishioners, and students.

In the Lord's Prayer we say, "Give us this day our daily bread." Scripture teaches that the good things of this life are the gifts of God. George Saboonjian, member of the church school board, was thankful for the good things he had in his life and wanted to share those blessings with others. He sponsored sixteen baskets that included turkey, potatoes, fresh fruits, canned vegetables, cereal, macaroni and cheese, milk, eggs, peanut butter, and much more. In beautifully decorated cartons with messages written by the students, parents and students weighed, packed, and delivered the baskets in teams of three students and one parent. Special appreciation to George for his generousity, to all the students who participated, and to Roseann Manoogian Attar, Violet Cholakian, Randi Dolik, Lydia and Steve Doyan, Patricia Hogikyan, Dyana Kezelian, Mona and Richard Kurjian, Nayiri Mirsirliyan, MaryAnn and Art Artinian, and teachers Dickran Toomajan and Margaret Arslanian.

Over 250 parishoners gathered for dinner in the hall to observe a community Thanksgiving, and to support the annual outreach program of the high school department sponsoring orphans in Armenia. \$1,000 was raised that supported four orphans through the Women's Guild CASP program. The students and parents prepared the meal, served, cleaned up and financially supported the event. Special thanks to coordinator Roseann and her committee: Audrey Armoudlian, Anita Arslanian, Harry Carman, Marilyn Dadian, Randi Dolik, Lydia Doyan, Alberta Godoshian, Barbara Gumushian, Sonia Kalfayan, Dyana Kezelian, Mona Kurjian, Greg Mamassian, Maral Mamassian, Lisa Mardigian, Nayiri Misirliyan, George Saboonjian, and Jeri Vartabedian.

DECEMBER ~ Christmas is an anticipated day of surprises for children - gifts under the tree. During these

difficult economic times, that was not possible for many families. The Habitat for Humanity sponsored "gift" baskets for families in the Detroit area. Through the generous financial support of Greg and Debra Koukoudian and Dr. Roy and Nayiri Misirliyan, four families of single-parent mothers and their children were given pajamas, books, and one gift on each child's wish list. The students packaged the gifts and delivered them to the Habitat office.

Oftentimes, adults question the music that young people listen to today. Jennifer Morris from the Diocesan Department of Youth Ministry in New York visited with our high school students discussing contemporary music and its affect on them. She illustrated how lyrics in some songs contain passages and references to the Bible. Jennifer tied current-day ideas and issues in music to the Bible, and showed the students how knowing the Bible would help them become better informed listeners when interpreting the lyrics.

2010 FUTURE OUTREACH PROGRAMS

The St John high school students will embark on many new programs in 2010. Some of the projects in the planning are a visitation to the Word of Faith Church in Southfield, a Habitat for Humanity Project, a trip to the Wayne State Armenian Room, the Second Annual Bike-a-thon for Armenia, visiting a soup kitchen, and a discussion with Fr. Garabed on the book *Christ the Lord Out of Egypt*.

Whenever you see our spirited youth in the hall or whenever they are working on an outreach project, please encourage them and support their efforts. We are a community of believers and by our example, we can lead our youth.

Marriages

Arrangements for weddings are to be made at least eight months in advance. Marriage preparation and counseling are required before the celebration of the sacrament. The Bestman (Khachyeghpayr) must be a member of the Armenian Orthodox Church. The parish office will make all necessary arrangements for the deacon, organist and soloist. Marriages are not celebrated during Great Lent.

Baptisms and Chrismations

All baptisms must be scheduled at least two months in advance. Pre-baptismal preparation for the parents and godparents is required. At least one of the godparents must be a member of the Armenian Orthodox Faith.

Regulation of Sacramental Services

In accordance with Diocesan discipline mandated by the Primate, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, all sacraments, e.g. funerals, weddings, baptisms and rites of Christian burial, can only be administered in the church sanctuary, which has been consecrated for the celebrations of these sacred rites.
